 Increase in Home Churches as discipleship training "reservoir" for missional initiatives and communities

- Greater use of Teaching Team at Deeper to build the "reservoir" further
- Strengthened "Band of Brothers" and "With Love" as training ministries
- Re-defined existing Sunday morning meetings as missional – "9.30am" and "The Gathering"

- The simple idea of "breathing in" to discipleship all those we meet in missional initiatives through to Home Churches and Deeper (with Band of Brothers and With Love) and then once trained "breathing out" new disciples into missional ministry continuously is considered vital if we are to effectively resource mission locally. (The Home Church leaders were consulted thoroughly before arriving at this motif).
- **Step 2 : Grow Home Churches :** Over the pMAP period the following targets for growth of Home Churches have been set
 - o 2019 2 Youth HC's / 3 New HCs achieved
 - o 2020 Grow 4 Home Churches
 - o 2021 Grow 4 Home Churches
 - Home Churches to be 24 in total by end 2021 triennium, as "discipleship reservoir" for missional deployment into the upcoming West Horton Heath MDA
- Step 3: Recruiting new Team to Deeper training and teaching – utilising BCM. RELAUNCH IN FIRST Q 2020
- **Step 4**: Re-commissioning *Band of Brothers* and *With Love* as Discipleship ministries. **BEGUN ESPECIALLY FELLOWSHIP**
- **Step 5 :** Re-Brand existing morning congregations as "missional communities".
 - 5A. Morning Service: Church Building 9.30am for those seeking a traditional expression of Anglican worship. BEGUN
 - 5B. The Gathering: Wyvern College 10.30am A contemporary expression with the values of Welcome, Warmth, Worship Unity. Vision of reaching and discipling young people. Full time Children and Youth Workers employed to build extensive teams.
